Nantahala Regional Library is the oldest regional library in North Carolina and one of the first regional libraries formed in the United States. It first began on May 1, 1937 when the Tennessee Valley Authority signed a contract with the Murphy Library Board to provide service at the construction site of the **Hiawassee Dam in Cherokee** County. Nantahala Regional Library became officially established on November 14, 1940 after construction on the Dam completed.
